April this year begins with the solemnity of Holy Week, a truly special time to focus our attention on the final days of the earthly mission of Jesus, the Christ, in whom God emptied God's very self for the sake of the entire created order.

I encourage everyone to worship not only on the Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday), April 2<sup>nd</sup>, but also on Maundy Thursday at 7:00 p.m. and Good Friday at 7:00 p.m. either in the building or via Zoom. These liturgies will immerse us in the "Great Three Days" or Triduum, which we share with Christians around the world.

Creating space within our hearts and minds by setting aside time for sacred encounters with our living God is essential for drawing close to Jesus and being renewed in our discipleship through the power of the Holy Spirit. Remember what I've been preaching about from the Gospel of John this past month – <u>belief</u> in Jesus (whether we are in the "darkness" or in the "light") depends on our <u>relationship</u> with Jesus, not on some consent to a particular set of doctrines. Holy Week is a time to nourish that relationship and strengthen our belief.





### Lutherans Restoring Creation Worship Service — April 23, 2023

Many of you have heard about the Epiphany Green Team, which is affiliated with a nationwide organization called Faith in Place (<a href="https://www.faithinplace.org/">https://www.faithinplace.org/</a>). The Green Team helps our congregation pay attention to our care of creation in our congregational life and provides suggestions for doing the same at home. For example, you may notice on Palm Sunday that we are using sustainable resources for our processional palms and also the dried palm crosses. We also recycle whatever items we can through the Carbondale waste management system.

Caring for our planet earth is a core responsibility given to humanity by God at the time of creation. Because of the increasing impact of human life on our natural environment, Christians have been turning to a renewed focus on Eco-Theology to re-introduce us to our role as environmental stewards.

One organization that supports efforts like this is called **Lutherans Restoring Creation** (LRC). The Green Team in cooperation with the Worship Committee will be using a special liturgy provided by LRC on **Sunday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>** (the day after Earth Day) as the focus of our worship service. Featured that day will be a (recorded) sermon by **The Rev. R. Guy Erwin**, president of United Lutheran Seminary.

The materials are scheduled to be released on April 9<sup>th</sup>, so we don't have further details to share at the moment. Simply come to worship on April 23<sup>rd</sup> with an open mind and heart to hear about our Christian responsibility for God's creation. #### Campus Ministry Support Opportunity: Valor Bible Study Lead, Brandon Wheeler

Friends in Christ,

Throughout the '22-'23 academic year, Epiphany Lutheran Church has been the host location for the Valor Bible Study Group for college students pursuing military leadership careers at both SIUC and SEMO. I have had the privilege of meeting weekly with the students during their Bible study to provide theological insight and information that they request. In their Air Force ROTC capacity, these students also happen to fall under the command of our own Epiphany member, **Lt Col Jessica Dwyer**.

The student who has organized and led the Valor group is named **Brandon Wheeler**. Brandon is significantly involved in discipleship ministry to fellow students on the SEMO campus. Not only does he mentor several groups on campus, but he has also spent his summers doing street ministry with a para-church organization in Orlando, Florida. Students participating in this ministry program must raise a portion of their own living expenses for the summer. The remaining portion is earned by part-time jobs in the tourism sector in Orlando. However, this year Brandon will be serving in a top leader-ship position which requires him to raise all expenses because the position does not allow enough time for outside employment. The total amount that Brandon needs to raise is \$5,500. 
Upon completing this summer's ministry program, Brandon will report to his first duty station as a newly commissioned officer in the United States Air Force.

### C/SIS Social Ministry, Justice, and Advocacy Grant

#### A Year-End Report March 25, 2023

Epiphany Lutheran Church, Carbondale, IL, was the recipient of an \$800.00, Social Ministry, Justice, and Advocacy grant from the Central and Southern Illinois Synod of the ELCA for 2022. The following report details how these funds have been utilized to accomplish the outlined mission of the C/SIS Social Ministry, Justice, and Advocacy Committee: "in serving, educating, and advocating in our society." As may be recalled, this grant was sought to aid Epiphany in meeting our commitment to help supply Bathroom Part I materials to the Shelter to Home Program. Shelter to Home provides household supplies for homeless persons as they are making the transition to more permanent housing. These people may be transitioning from an emergency shelter to local organizations including the Carbondale Warming Center, Good Samaritan Ministries, the Survivor Empower-

ment Center [Women's Shelter], and Centerstone. In addition, Shelter to Home supplies

are available for people coming from other localities throughout the southern Illinois area, as they present the need.

Since grant funds were first received in early September 2022, volunteers **Mike and Carolyn Langan** have maintained a supply of baskets in the church's storage room, both complete and ready for delivery, as well as some "loose materials" not yet constituting 'complete' baskets. These supplies include contributions donated by members of our congregation, as well as items purchased using grant funds. Since members may make donations of whatever kind and at any time of their choosing, we have no structured formalized procedure for tracking or recording donations to the program. All grant monies that have been spent were for the purchase of baskets and materials needed to fill them. A Receiving/Delivery Ledger has been employed to track basket deliveries as they are made to various sites.

Our initial objective for Epiphany's Shelter to Home obligation was to provide 2 baskets per delivery, on an average of once every 2 to 3 weeks (equating to roughly 22 deliveries or 44 baskets per year). However, our ultimate objective is that these supplies always be ready, available, and easily accessible to people making the transition. In addition, at the outset, it was anticipated that all deliveries would be made to a dedicated storage area located at the Carbondale Warming Center. As some time passed, though, we learned that some persons making the transition to housing would be able to access supplies more easily if we delivered supplies directly to storage sites including the Good Samaritan Emergency Shelter and the Sparrow Coalition storage locker, in addition to the Warming Center. With this in mind, for the past couple of months, we have made deliveries of 3 baskets each to those two additional sites.

At this juncture, it has been about 28 weeks since grant funds first became available, and 12 deliveries have been made since that time, totaling 28 baskets. Although deliveries have not followed the initially projected rough schedule of 2 baskets once every 2 to 3 weeks, 28 baskets translates to a figure of about one basket delivered per week. Compared to a starting projection of roughly 22 deliveries over the course of a year, those 28 baskets delivered over a period of six months would seem to meet our hoped-for target.

Following this report are photos which include Epiphany's Delivery/Receiving Ledger and basket deliveries being made to the Warming Center and the Sparrow Coalition's storage locker.




